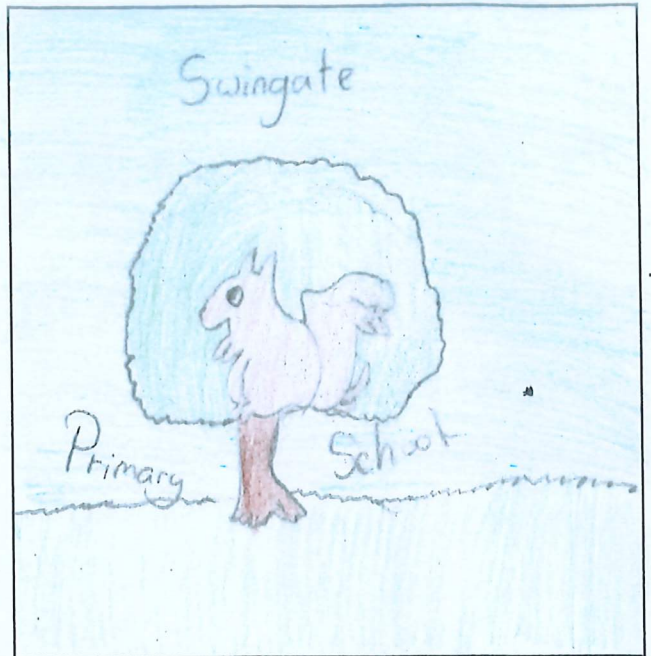


Swingate School Smash the Secret 2024 Challenge!!!
